### **Understanding English, communication and languages:**

We will learn to write adventure stories based on The Owl who was Afraid of the Dark and Non-Chronological Reports about habitats.

We will learn how to structure these texts and make careful vocabulary choices to enrich our writing.

## Scientific and technological understanding We will learn to:

- Explore & compare differences between things that are living, dead, & things that have never been alive
- Identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited & describe how habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals/plants, and how they depend on each other
