### Oak Class

## **Attendance**

I am asking again for your support to further improve our whole school attendance as this impacts upon our children's education. Our aspirational target for every child is that over the whole year they achieve 97% attendance which is no more than 5 days off in a year. The Government's national expectation is 96%, the equivalent of 7 days absence per year. Evidence shows that good attendance is a key factor enabling children to reach their potential. Steps could include avoiding taking any holidays during term times and keeping medical appointments outside of school hours. Thank you for your ongoing support.
