



St Joseph's Sports EVALUATED Action Plan including Sports Premium Funding Plan 2023-2024

At St Joseph's Catholic Primary School, Exmouth, the staff and Governors recognise the important contribution that PE makes to the health and well-being of the children.

We consider that a strong PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude, emotional and academic achievement of all pupils of all abilities, needs, backgrounds and ages. We are committed to ensuring that all pupils receive at least 2 hours of high quality curriculum PE per week as well as having the opportunity to attend a range of sporting clubs delivered by confident and well trained teachers. The successful delivery of the curriculum supports all aspects of health education within the school.

School Sport Premium:

From September 2013, all maintained Primary schools have been awarded the School Sports Premium funding. This money is ring-fenced and must be used to support the provision of quality PE and sport.

During the academic year 2023 - 2024, St Joseph's will receive approximately £17,320.00

Strategy for the use of PE and Sports Premium Funding 2023-2024

Key Achievements to date:

Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need

- Continue to extend our after school sports provision.
- Sports provision to include wrap around care
- Continue with high quality CPD for teaching staff.
- Increase the proportion of children that can swim 25 meters unaided.
- Increase the number of pupils taking part in inter-school sporting activities and competitions.
- More pupils with SEND or pupils eligible for pupil premium to access sporting events and fixtures in the wider community.
- St Joseph's to host more tournaments and events with other schools in the Exmouth community.

Rationale: St Joseph's Catholic Primary School is dedicated to delivering high quality PE & school sport to all children. We aim to raise standards in PE and equip the children with the desire, skills, knowledge and understanding necessary to lead a healthy lifestyle.
