Plymouth CAST Behaviour Policy and Relationships Policy

As you may already be aware, as a school we are working towards becoming a Trauma Informed School (TIS). I am currently in the process of attending the 11 days training to achieve the diploma with TISUK which will be achieved by May 2024. We have updated our Behaviour policy to be in line with TIS and Plymouth CAST Policy alongside a relationships policy. Which you will now find on our school website.

Safeguarding Updates:

The Department for Education (DfE) has published an updated version of the statutory safeguarding and child protection guidance for schools in England, Keeping children safe in education (KCSIE). This guidance replaced KCSIE 2022 when it came into force on 1 September 2023.

The guidance sets out what schools and colleges in England must do to safeguard and promote the welfare of children and young people under the age of 18. Updates made in 2023 include:

- clarification around the roles and responsibilities of education staff in relation to filtering and monitoring
- clarification that being absent, as well as missing, from education can be warning sign of a range of safeguarding concerns, including sexual abuse, sexual exploitation or child criminal exploitation
- additional information on online pre-recruitment checks for shortlisted candidates
- information on responding to allegations related to organisations or individuals using school premises.

Gospel Value - Humility
