Balance Bikeability – Oak Class

Lunch Times at St Jo's

We have been conducting a review into activities we can offer at lunchtime here at St Jo's, and we have found several ways we can make things even better for our children. As part of this process we tasked the School Council to find out what the children would like in some new **playground zones** (that we are going to create soon). The zones will mean children can choose what sorts of activities they would like to do and be in an area where they can do these without fear of other activities getting in the way. With this in mind, we are going a bit old school... If your child would like to, they are welcome to bring in Top Trumps (not trading cards though please), Elastics (the game usually played with 3 children that is a little bit like skipping) and Cats Cradle loops of wool. Please feel free to explore how these games are played with your children at home and then they can introduce them to their friends here – Elastics can become very advanced! (Please also label Top Trumps/Elastics with your surname so we have more chance of returning them if they get lost)
